## 25th Anniversary Event is October 1st!

In trying to research the history of Walden Day, now known as Harvest Fest, I realize that there is much that needs to be researched. So I am going to ask the residents of Walden to help me out, while I call people "in the know" and long timers in our wonderful village.

So if anyone has any input, please email me at president@waldencommunitycouncil.org or call me at 778-3950. I am looking forward t your input and stories. I think this will be fun to hear the stories and memories of those people that had something to do with Walden Day's inception or just a fond memory from the last 25 years.

So far I've discovered, around 1983 the Village had what was called "Salute to Walden" held at the MPB School. It was a gathering of dignitaries and residents all sharing a good time. In 1986, James Bondur was Mayor and David Heacock was Village Manager. The two men and the board decided to move the event to the Square and Call it "Walden Day". Cathy Foran who was a village employee and long time resident took on the huge task of putting the event together.

As the event became bigger, it became difficult for the Village staff to handle on their own. Cathy Foran, who was a key player was also moving away. In 1997, the word spread that Walden Day might be cancelled. In stepped the newly formed Walden Community Council! Derrick Wynkoop and David Cocks, officers of the Community Council along with Paula Quist took on the responsibility & the Walden Community Council has held responsibility for the event for the rest of it's 15 years!

The event was moved from August to October in 2003, in an effort to avoid the high heat & accompanying thunderstorms and re-named Harvest Fest. Harvest Fest currently includes the following events:
