Albany Avenue Parking

The Board of Trustees met at the entrance to Bradley Park on Albany Avenue where Fire Chief Paul Pullar stated that some of his concerns regarding the ability of the fire truck to make right and left hand turns from several streets besides Bergen and Pleasant Avenue, two that he mentioned were George Street and Second Street.

The first street the fire truck came out of was Bergen Avenue making a right hand turn. The first problem observed was that the red truck parked directly across from Bergen Avenue on Albany Avenue would have been destroyed by the fire truck. The fire

truck was also unable to maneuver the turn and had to back up and move forward very slowly many times. It also came very close to the telephone pole or was going over the curb and the storm drain.

It was determined that from 26 Albany Avenue to the Scout Cabin there could not be any parking. Also, the Board questioned if there could not be any parking 15' from an intersection.

The next turn was a left hand turn of which several Board Members stood in the parking area pretending to be cars. Again the truck was unable to make the left hand turn and it was clearly shown that the red truck as well as several cars would be destroyed. The Board determined there should be no parking to 30 Albany Avenue.

The next was Pleasant Avenue and again the truck could not make the turn. The Board determined there should not be parking from 50 Albany Avenue to Thruway Market. They also talked about the issue of speeding on Albany Avenue and looked into speed ramps for the road going down the hill.
